North Bergen, Pascack Hills lead in wrestling

Paramus gives Bruins a battle

HACKENSACK — North Bergen's Tony Tabbacchino and Paramus's Bill Savage spent part of last night dashing between the two mats, checking on their wrestlers in the quarterfinal round of the Bergen County Holiday Wrestling tournament.

"It's a whole lot better trying to be in two 'places at once than being no place," Tabbacchino reasoned.

And North Bergen and Paramus were in the two places — No. 1 and No. 2 – in the Hackensack satellite heading into the semifinals and finals today. The Bruins, the only non-Bergen County team in the 32-school field, scored 96 points, 8½ more than the surprising Spartans.

Paramus advanced six wrestlers into the semifinals of the eight who entered the quarters, while North Bergen placed five of its eight.

"We're not nearly the team North Bergen is," said Paramus coach Savage, "but this is a young team which really works hard. I'm just hoping we can be in the top five when this thing is over, and some of my kids can take their medals and show them to their peers and say, 'This is what I achieved.'

The most surprising achievement by a Spartan was by 141-pounder Joe Maio, an 8-8 wrestler last year who beat three district place winners yesterday, including Northern Highlands' Lee Martino, 6-2, in the quarterfinals.

Bob Suriano (101), Art Paladino (135), sophomore Rob Young (148), Tom Brulato (158) and Pete Kalksma (188) were the other Spartans to advance, Brulato

at the expense of North Bergen's James Takakjian.

But the Bruins' Steve McMahon (122), a junior varsity wrestler last year, had eliminated Paramus standout Kurt Massey, 5-4, in the opening round. Mc-Mahon was joined by teammates John Crowley (108), Lee Argush (129), Ray Denti (170) and heavyweight Art Scotto in the semifinals.

"We like coming to Bergen County, partly because we've got no place else to go for good competition," Tabbacchino said. "Kearny is the only Hudson

County school we wrestle. If the athletic directors and boards of education in Hudson County would wake up and see the need for wrestling, we'd be better prepared for this."

Pascack Valley was hardly prepared for last night. The Indians entered wrestlers in just eight of the 12 weight classes, but the four who reached the quar-

terfinals — Gary Beyer (115), Dave Weck (122), Dave Galdi (135) and Bruce Haberli (148) — all won.

Galdi recorded a 1:27 overtime pin

over Chris Bojanovic of Fort Lee after they tied in regulation, 2-2. Paladino, the other 135-pounder to advance, was tied by Dumont's Dave Wightman, 3-3, in the closing seconds of regulation but posted a 4-1 overtime decision.

Defending champion Brian Young of Fort Lee (188) barely edged Ramapo's Bob Laauwe, 5-4, to ramain in contention. Laauwe needed 12 more seconds of riding time to force the quarterfinal match into overtime.





FAIR LAWN — It pays to have a rec-

reational wrestling program.

Fair Lawn, accustomed to fielding strong wrestling teams, fell on hard times a few years ago. So coach Daniel DeLuca convinced some reluctant parents and alumni to help organize a program similar to one that was keeping Pascack Hills in clover year after year, one in which seventh- and eighth-graders would wrestle once or twice a week.

The Cutters are beginning to cash in their chips from that decision. After finishing 15th in last year's Bergen County Holiday Wrestling Tournament, the Cutters are a strong third in the 16-school Fair Lawn satellite entering the semifinal round of this year's tournament.

"Everybody's doing it now," says De-Luca. "A program's a must thing."

Of the five Cutters who won their quarterfinal matches last night, four are products of the program — Rick Babitts, Glenn Nacion, Frank Guadagnino and Dave Laube. The only exception is Leo Miller.

DeLuca, the 14-year Cutter coach, describes the current crop as his best in five years. It delighted the large hometown contingent in a standing-room-only gym by capturing five of its six quarter-final matches for a total of 68½ points.

Pascack Hills, seeking its fifth straight Holiday Tournament title, coasted comfortably in first place with 117½ points after winning seven of eight quarterfinal matches. River Dell stood second at 76½, advancing four wrestlers out of seven quarterfinalists.

The quarterfinal winners move to Hackensack today for the conclusion of the 18th annual classic.

Fair Lawn's biggest triumph last night was a nip-and-tuck battle at 129 pounds between Nacion and Pascack Hills junior Bruce Bates, who had never lost a high-school match. Nacion, ex-

hausted through the last three minutes, hung on for a 6-5 decision after breaking a 3-3 tie with three straight points.

The frustrated Bates kicked at Nacion afterwards. "The referee never saw it," said DeLuca.

"The kid held his leg and Bates kicked away from it," Hills coach Bucky Rehain said. "He's not that way at all. I think the kick was misunderstood."

That was the only break in Pascack Hills' string of quarterfinal victories. Rob Davis (108), Bob Lavery (135), last year's MVP Chris Catalfo (141), Jim Lockatell (158), Steve Bessette (170), Howie Lindstrom (188) and heavyweight Ron Dini breezed through their matches. Davis, Lavery, Bessette, Lindstrom and Dini each had three pins for the day.

"We predicate everything on the pin," said Rehain. "We won seven matches, but the pins make the difference.

"Dini is a big surprise for us. He lost some weight playing football — he weighs 190 — and we didn't know if he could handle heavyweight."

Dini apparently can, and the Cowboys finished their night with a flourish. Bessette arched Bergenfield's John Bacci high on his neck, Lindstrom applied a pretty cross-face cradle on Old Tappan's Joe Giavannone and Dini pressed Old Tappan's Joe D'Apolito with a half-nelson.

Catalfo rolls despite 'disadvantage'

HACKENSACK — Pins usually don't come easy in the championship round of a wrestling tournament. There were none Friday night in the finals of the Bergen County Holiday Tournament. But Chris Catalfo, Pascack Hills' 141-pounder, felt he was at a particular disadvantage.

"The refs don't let me use bars too much," said Catalfo, whose favorite pinning move involves barring [prying] his opponent's straightened arm behind the opponent's back. "That's how I made most of my pins last year. But they don't give it to me anymore."

So, deprived of the maneuver, Catalfo had to settle for a 15-0 decision over Joe Maio of Paramus. That victory, coupled with his four other wins in the tournament, was enough for Catalfo to be voted the most valuable wrestler for the second straight year.

His opponents undoubtedly can't feel much sympathy toward Catalfo, last year's 135-pound champ. Despite being forced to break three times for using a potentially-dangerous move, he still had an easy time in the final match. A reversal and predicament in the first 15 seconds of the second period gave Catalfo a commanding 6-0 lead, and he boosted that to 14-0 before the period was over.

His team's fifth straight Holiday Tournament crown was almost as simple. Pascack Hills had three champions out of five finalists—Catalfo, Bob Davis and Steve Bessette—and finished with 173½ points. North Bergen took second at 128½ with one champion, 129-pounder Lee Argush.

Paramus was blanked in three championship tries but still managed to

shade Fair Lawn for third place, 115-144. The Cutters had two champions, Rick Babitts and Dave Laube. River Dell, with two champions (Mark Heller, Vic DellaTorre), took fifth place with 106½ points.

Hackensack, an 8-6-1 club last year, took sixth place on victories by Bill Nixon and Vito Errico.

Pascack Hills' triumph, coming before a crowd of about 1,700, wasn't surprising. But the complete absence of pins was, considering last year's finals contained four. Even Bessette, who had nailed his first four opponents this year in a combined time of six minutes, 40 seconds, could only outpoint Ramapo's Steve Cannon. Bessette won, 11-4, on a dandy second-period move that almost gave him a pin without first gaining

control.

Every championship match except 115 pounds was decided by the second period.

Fort Lee's 115-pounder, Don Balestri, trailed Gary Beyer of Pascack Valley, 3-2, and started on the bottom to open the third period. But he quickly used a turn-in for a reversal and picked up a penalty point on the move because Beyer had clasped his arms. That made the score 5-3, and Balestri went on to win, 6-4.

The only other encounter of the suspenseful kind was at 101, where District champion Leo Miller of Fair Lawn met Nixon, a district runnerup.

Nixon, who weighed 65 pounds as a freshman three years ago, twisted out of Miller's grasp for a 1-0 lead early in the second period. He caught Miller with a two-leg takedown 90 seconds later. Miller sat out for a third-period escape but could do no more, and Nixon won. 4-1.

Pascack Hills' Davis, the 101 champ last year, rallied from a 3-2 deficit with a half-nelson takedown and predicament and went on to beat Lyndhurst's Mike DeMarco, 11-3, for the 108-pound crown.

Babitts, a junior with the build of a greyhound, outmuscled North Bergen's Steve McMahon, 6-0, for the 122 crown, an encore to his 115 title last year.



Added weight agrees with Fri Dec 30, 1977 River Dell ace

HACKENSACK — "I don't know if I should say this," said Vic Della-Torre, "but I really weigh 176

pounds."


Now that isn't the confession of the century, but DellaTorre says he's been telling people he weighs 184. No matter — he wears his lack of weight well. The River Dell standout defeated a bona-fide 188-pounder, Pascack Hills' Howie Lindstrom, Friday night for his second consecutive Bergen County Holiday Wrestling Tournament title.

DellaTorre did it the hard way, moving up two weight classes from his 158-pound division of last year. Gaining two classes was much easier than gaining 30 pounds for Della-

Torre.

His never-ending battle for bulk began last summer. "I lifted weights, I drank milkshakes. . . After football I weighed about 180. Then I started wrestling and I couldn't keep my weight up.

"Around tournament time you get nervous. You start forcing food

down, and it doesn't work. Lots of wrestlers say they aren't nervous, that it's not taking off any weight, but it does for me.

And the five matches get to you, both mentally and physically."

Lindstrom had pinned three opponents Thursday, then outpointed defending 188-pound champion Brian Young of Fort Lee to reach the final. But DellaTorre stayed close to the stomach of the Cowboy senior and away from the powerful legs of Lindstrom to score the first five points and win, 10-3.

So DellaTorre now returns to the enviable task of eating and eating. Why does he do it? "I like it up

here," he says.

TOURNAMENT NOTES — Bill Savage, the coach of Paramus, said before the finals, "I'd rather have six finalists that don't win than one that does." He got half his wish: three finalists who didn't win — Joe Maio, Bob Young and Tom Brulato. But the trio's prior successes propelled the Spartans to a surprising third-place finish.

Chris Catalfo is the first wrestler to win back-to-back MVP awards in the 14 years they have been presented. Tom Husted (1975) is the only other Pascack Hills wrestler to have

won it.

Pascack Hills' fifth straight title broke the mark of four straight held by Bergenfield (1965-8). The Bears, hit hard by graduation after finishing third in last year's holiday tournament, were eliminated in Thursday night's quarterfinals and wound up in 17th place, with 24½ points.

Pascack Valley's Dave Galdi has a good memory to go with his 135-pound title. After blanking Pascack Hills' Bob Lavery, 5-0, Galdi remembered that they had met twice before, as sophomores two years ago. "I beat him 13-5, and he beat me 4-2," Galdi said. "I felt I had control of him [tonight]."
