Bergenfield tourney draws 16 mat squads

Holiday wrestling tournament action resumes tomorrow with three more tournaments getting under way, including the largest and oldest of them all—the Bergen County Coaches competition at Bergenfield High.

Action in the 13th annual affair, which will feature full teams from 16 invited schools, starts at 12 noon. It will continue throughout the day with quarterfinal round bouts at 8 tomorrow night. Several mats will be used for the early rounds and consolation bouts. The tourney finals Thursday night will be on one mat.

Also listed for tomorrow are two eight-school tournaments, one at Park Ridge and the other at Bogota. The Bogota competition also starts at noon, with the one at Park Ridge beginning at 6 p.m. Park Ridge will have its second round Thursday afternoon and consolation and finals that night. Bogota will get down to the consolation (third place) and championship rounds the first day, and have only one session Thursday night.

A fourth tourney is scheduled for Saturday at Dumont. This will be a four-school affair starting at 1 p.m., with the consolation and finals starting at 7 o'clock.

Host team defends

Bergenfield is the defending team champion in the Coaches' meet. Alex Turnamian's Bears ended Pascack Valley's two-year reign in the meet at Passaic Valley High a year ago. Previously Bergenfield had won a record four straight titles under Sal Cascio. Teaneck Hackensack and East Paterson are the only other schools to have won team titles.

The Bears also have won the most individual championships in past meets with 20, one more than Pascack Valley matmen have garnered. Fair Lawn has won 13 and Teaneck 10 individual titles.

Several boys successful in last year's tournament will be back. One is Alvin Walker of Englewood, voted the outstanding wrestler in the 1971 competition. Walker is moving up from the 106 to 115-pound class where Jack Grimaldi, the 1971 champion at that weight, returns. Grimaldi has been given the No. 1 seed and Walker No. 2.

This is one of the most competitive weight divisions in the tournament, for Chris Bowe of Ridgewood and John Viscardi of Hackensack, both district champions a year ago, are entered. Bowe got the third seed and Viscardi No. 4.

Tim Rooney of Bergenfield is a returning district champion in the 98-pound class and Scott Furman of Pascack Hills, the 1971 state champion at 98 pounds, is now wrestling at 106. As they are the only returning district champions at their weights, there is no seeding in either class.

There are two returning district champions in the 136-pound division. Neil Della Torre of River Dell and Bob McAleese of Saddle Brook are in that division.

Jeff Boyd, a returning regional champion from Westwood, is top seeded and Frank Bitetto of Hackensack rated No. 2 in the 157-pound competition.

There are two outstanding unlimited wrestlers returning, with Mike Murburg of Old Tappan runner-up in the state champiouships last year, in one half of the draw and Ted Klaube of North Bergen in the other.

There are no seeds in any other weight classes.

Bill Powley of Teaneck is tournament director. Officials will be Frank Bennett, Stan Thornton, Robert Dickstein, Spike Israel, Louis Jasmine and William Quinn.

BERGENFIELD — Westwood and Passaic Valley were tied at 25% points each following the opening two rounds of the 13th annual Bergen County Coaches Association Holiday Wrestling tournament at Bergenfield High last night. But Westwood advanced seven competitors into today's semifinal round, scheduled for moon, compared to six for the Little Falls school.

Hackensack, also with six survivors of the hectic action held on three mats before standing room crowds, was very much in contention with 23½ points, while Bergenfield was fourth with 17½ but with only four semifinalists.

The other 12 schools in the field seemed out of title contention, although 14 schools still have at least one grappler in the running for individual honors.

The tournament concludes tonight. Following the semifinals at noon, consolation bouts for third place will get underway at 7 p. m. and the championship bouts at 8 o'clock.

Tournament officials had indicated they will limit the attendance to 1,000.

A number of pre-tourney favorites will not be seen in competition today. Alvin Walker of Englewood, the tourney's "outstanding wrestler" award winner a year ago, was scratched because of personal problems. Mike Murburg of Old Tappan, the 6-5, 265-pound heavyweight who won the silver medal in the state meet at Princeton last year, was sidelined because of a shoulder injury received in practice. And North Bergen's highly regarded heavyweight Ted Klaube also missed the tourney because of an injury not connected with wrestling.

The fastest of the numerous pins turned in during the day was recorded by Chris Bove of Ridgewood when he won his opening bout at 115 pounds in 25 seconds at the expense of Tim Sappath of Pascack Hills. Bove also pinned his man in the second round but it took him 5:52 to dispose of Mauri Manzi of Saddle Brook.

Scott Furman of Pascack Hills, the 98-pound state champion a year ago, picked up a pair of quick pins, while Jack Grimaldi of Bergenfield, another of the All-Bergen wrestlers in the competition, scored a pin and a shutout victory in his matches. Both have moved up one weight class.

BERGENFIELD, -- Westwood High joined the big boys in Bergen - County wrestling. circles last night when John Kane's well-balanced team walked off with championship honors in the 13th annual Bergen County Coaches' Holiday when Jim Keough, a 15-year-Wrestling Festival.

The Cardinals, who have been competing in the tournament for the past six years, won the title for the first time. with 921/2 points, far outdistancing the rest of the field. Co-favorite-Hackensack was second with 651/2 and Passaic Valley third with 561/2.

Westwood practically clinched the title during the. semifinals by placing six wres-"tlers in the finals. Four Cardi-__nals__won_gold_medals_lastnight and Jeff Boyd also took home the "outstanding wres--tler" trophy. -

Boyd dominated the 157 divi--sion_as_no_other-wrestler han-dled his weight class. He _scored-two-pins-and-two-shut--out decisions, one by 11-0 and the other by 7-0. The latter was the score of the final. round bout against Charlie Trippeda of Teaneck. Trippe--da-also-was-a-losing-finalist-ayear ago when he competed at -178 pounds.

Hackensack was the only . other school to win more than _one_championship, capturing a pair. Passaic Valley, Bergenfield, Pascack Valley, Pascack 'Hills- and New Milford each won one gold.

The championship clinching. came in the first title bout old_freshman_edged_Tim_Rooney of Bergenfield, 3-2, for the 98-pound title. Keough showed. the results of the clinic program-Kane has Installed in the , and riding time. DiMatteo lost Westwood system in the lower schools for he had all the. moves-and surprising strength as well-to cope with Rooney, a senior with three years of experience in scholastic competition.

Scott Furman, the state champion at 98 pounds a year : ago who has moved up one weight class this year, met surprising opposition from Ted-Davis, a Westwood junior, before-winning a 5-0 decision. The Pascack-Hills veteran was in command all the time, but was unable to come close to a pin. He had won his first threebouts by falls in 2:31 or less.

Jack Grimaldi of Bergenfield, another All-County wres--tler last year and defending champion at 115 pounds, also had to battle to win, 8-3, over John Viscardi. Another repeater was. Steve Stallman of New

Milford, who moved up from the 123-pound class to win at 130 pounds over Hackensack's -Mike Hogan, 2-0.

One of the better final boutswas at 136 pounds where Neil Della Torre of River Dell barely edged.Bob McAleese of Saddle Brook, 5-4. Another action bout was in the 148-pound division in which Vie Santella of Passaic Valley bested Hackensack's Frank DiMatteo, 6-4, with the aid of a penalty point his temper for a spell, as well as the match.

One of the most satisfied of all the 192 matmen in the tournament today is. Westwood's Paul Jambor. Although he had to compete most of last year in the unlimited division because of the personnel makeup of the Cardinals, he won the 168-pound title.

Robin Osborne accounted for the fourth Westwood title in the 178-pound division, while Klein gave Hackensack its second in the heavyweight class, 1-0.

Dave Irwin of Old Tappan at 123 pounds and Bill McKellar of Pascack Valley at 141 were the other champions crowned last night.





Thursday December 28, 1972 Coaches honor Jess Jones

EACH YEAR for the past several tournaments someone who has made a major contribution to scholastic wrestling in Bergen County has been singled out by the Bergen County Coaches Association to receive an award of special merit. The recipient of the 1972 award just prior to the opening bouts in the championship round at Bergenfield High last night was Jess W. Jones.

Born and educated in Pennsylvania where he excelled in football and wrestling, Jones



came to Leonia after a World War 2 career in the Air Corp. and introduced wrestling at that school. He taught and coached wrestling there from 1946 through 1951 at a time when only four Bergen schools were represented in that sport. The others were Teaneck, Lodi and Fair Lawn. The number of wrestling teams in Bergen has now grown to more than 50.

Jones had fine success at Leonia, turning out many district champions and two state champions during his tenure. No longer coaching, or even in the teaching profession, Jones returned to Bergen County for this year's tournament. He should get a great deal of personal satisfaction from the coaches' tournament.

WRESTLING has long since come into its own as a major sport in New Jersey high schools, with more than 280 now conducting programs on a varsity level. This is a long stride forward since a half dozen or so schools succeeding in gaining recognition with the first state championship tournament in 1934.

During the early years of wrestling competition, the rural schools, possibly because they were not competitive with the city schools in basketball, dominated the scene. Newton, for example, won 12 team titles prior to the elimination of an overall state title in 1961. Union with five titles and Teaneck and Washington with four each were Newton's closest competitors. Roselle Park had three team trophies.

In 1961 the New Jersey State Interscholastic A.A. ended the awarding of state team championships as the entry list grew so much that regional championships were substituted. Championships are still awarded on an individual basis, however.

Once again, athletes from the rural and suburban schools hold an edge in gold medals. Newton matmen have made a harvest of 79 gold medals alone. Union (39) and Washington (37) are its closest rivals Teaneck is Bergen's top hoarder of the gold with 27, tying Roselle Park for the No. 4 spot. Other Bergen schools with good representation are Leonia (8), Fair Lawn (5) and Bergenfield (4). Cliffside Park and Pascack Hills, with two each. are the only other Bergen schools with more than one individual state winner down through the years.

BERGENFIELD'S Ed Kochakji is one of only two athletes who have ever been acclaimed the "outstanding wrestler" in two state meets. He shares that honor with Gerald Nisivoccia of J.P. Stevens, who was a two-time winner in 1970-71. Kochakji won his titles in 1967-68. Other Bergen winners of that award have been Dennis Sullivan of Leonia in 1951, and Ray Reichert (1957) and Kerin Raftery (1963), both of Fair Lawn.

Only seven athletes have been three-time state champions, and two of them are former Bergen aces. They are Kochakji from 1966-68 and Robert Moone (Teaneck) from 1939-41. Moone was the first ever in that category. Four of the remaining five have been from Newton and the final one was Mike Frick of Pope John in Sparta, the "outstanding" matman of 1972. Frick came the closest to bring a four-time winner. He won at 98 pounds the closest to being a four-time a sophomore although he did make the state playoffs at Princeton, and then won in 1971 (at 115) and completed his schoolboy career as the 123-pound champion last March. He's now a freshman at Lehigh.
