Fair Lawn sends nine to quarters

HACKENSACK — Fair Lawn wrestling coach Frank Guadagnino watched nine of his wrestlers reach last night's quarterfinal round of the Bergen County Coaches Association tournament. He watched another one that didn't.

WRESTLING

That was the the painful one.

Although the favored Cutters put themselves in a great position to repeat as tournament champion, Guadagnino couldn't help but think of what could have been. His 121-pound wrestler, Rich Rubino, held a 6-3 lead against River Dell's Sean Aurigemma with seven seconds left in their match yesterday afternoon.

"He decided to relax," Guadagnino said of Rubino. "He got reversed and got pinned. To see Rich lose was the heartbreaker of the afternoon."

Before last night's quarterfinal round was completed, Guadagnino was confident his nine wrestlers would be alive for tomorrow's semifinal round at Hackensack High School. Cofavorite Pascack Hills and Paramus also fared well, sending eight wrestlers each into the quarters.

The upset of the afternoon was turned in by Cutters freshman Ja-

son Barch. The 100-pounder pinned top-seeded Dom Alessio of Cliffside Park in a second-round match at 3:16.

"He controlled the entire match," Guadagnino said.

Barch would get little time to savor the victory. Paramus's Matt Lombardi, who posted two pins in a combined 56 seconds, was scheduled to meet Barch in the quarters.

Mike Panico (114), Jamie Piscane (128), Joe Mocco (140), and Carmine Tirone (147) each had two pins for the powerful Cutters.

Paramus, which finished second last season, was true to form with defending 115-pound champion Ken Carmichael leading the way. Carmichael, who suffered a groin pull in last week's Ramsey tournament, registered falls of 43 and 57 seconds wrestling at 128.

Rob Meehan, who suffered a shoulder injury in the Ramsey tournament, also bounced back with two technical falls at 134. But the biggest surprise for the Spartans was 121-pounder Mike Indoraco, who stunned Fort Lee's Benji Rubin in the second round with a pin at the 2:50 mark.

"He's wrestled great for us," Paramus coach Joe Cervino said.

"We'll see what he can do against [Pascack Hills' Andy] Van Horn in the quarters. Van Horn's the regional champion."

Pascack Hills rode first- and second-round pins from Matt Grossman (100), Rich James (107),

Shane Van Horn (128), and defending state champion Brian Wells (147). Jeff Lally, Hills' 134-pounder, contributed a pin and technical fall.

Emerson, the fourth overall finisher last season, appears headed for another Group 1 championship. The Cavos had six wrestlers alive going into the quarters.

Caldwell tournament champions Mike Mazzeo (147), and Joe Mazzeo (157) each registered falls in their two bouts, as did Emerson 100-pounder Bruce Feingold. Joe Harriman (114), Dave Toci (187), and heavyweight Rob Roselli were the other winners for the Cavos.

Others expected to move into tomorrow's semifinals are county runners-up Frank Manning (134) of Bergenfield, and Marc Peyko (169) of Lodi. Manning had two pins in a combined 1:23, and Peyko had two technical falls.

Mahwah's Drew Black, third in the state at 101 last season, posted two pins wrestling at 108.

Indorato surprises Van Horn

HACKENSACK — When defending county champion Andy Van Horn of Pascack Hills moved up in weight class this season, the Paramus High School wrestling team looked at it two ways: It was good news for Steve Katz, but bad news for Mike Indorato.

First, the good news. Katz, who lost to Van Horn in last year's Bergen County Coaches Association tournament, cruised into the 107-pound semifinals last night without a Van Horn in his way.

Now, the bad news. Indorato met Van Horn in a third-round match, as the Spartans and Cowboys struggled to keep pace with mighty Fair Lawn in the team standings.

For Paramus, the bad news never transpired. Indorato stunned the previously undefeated Van Horn with a 12-4 decision, as the Spartans finished with 111 points heading into tomorrow's semifinal and championship rounds at Hackensack High School. Fair Lawn leads the pack with 132 points, and Pascack Hills is second with 118.

"In a way, we were looking forward to the match," said Paramus coach Joe Cervino. "Mike always had the potential. He dedicated himself to getting in shape this year, and he's in real good condi-

tion."

Van Horn, the defending Region 1 champion, is known for his take-down ability. Cervino and Indorato worked all week on how to combat it.

"He loves to tie up the near arm," Cervino said of Van Horn. "That's how he beat Katz last year. He's got a great arm-bar series and works his tilts well."

Indorato, 2-2 as a sophomore last season, was able to stand up to Van Horn's best stuff. He wound up breaking down his opponent's hip, escaping to a neutral, and taking down Van Horn with a fireman's carry. A two-point take-down and a two-point near-fall clinched the upset.

"He's 8-0 on the season," Cervino said of Indorato. "He's going to go a long way."

Fair Lawn sent eight wrestlers into the semifinals, including defending county champions John Reese (169) and Neil Wright (157).

Reese followed up a technical fall with two pins, and Wright recorded three falls. Carmine Tirone (147), Joe Mocco (140), Jamie Piscane (128), and Mike Panico (114) each pinned two of their three opponents. Freshman Jason Barch (100) matched Wright with three falls, including a 57-second pin of

top-seeded Dom Alessio of Cliffside Park.

Cutters coach Frank Guadagnino watched nine of his wrestlers reach the third round. Only 134-pounder Christian Tirone was stopped, losing to Jeff Lally of Pascack Hills in overtime. Lally is the defending 115-pound District 1

hard-fought 5-2 decision over Leo Rossi of Fort Lee. Defending state champion Brian Wells (147) had two pins and a technical fall en route to the semis.

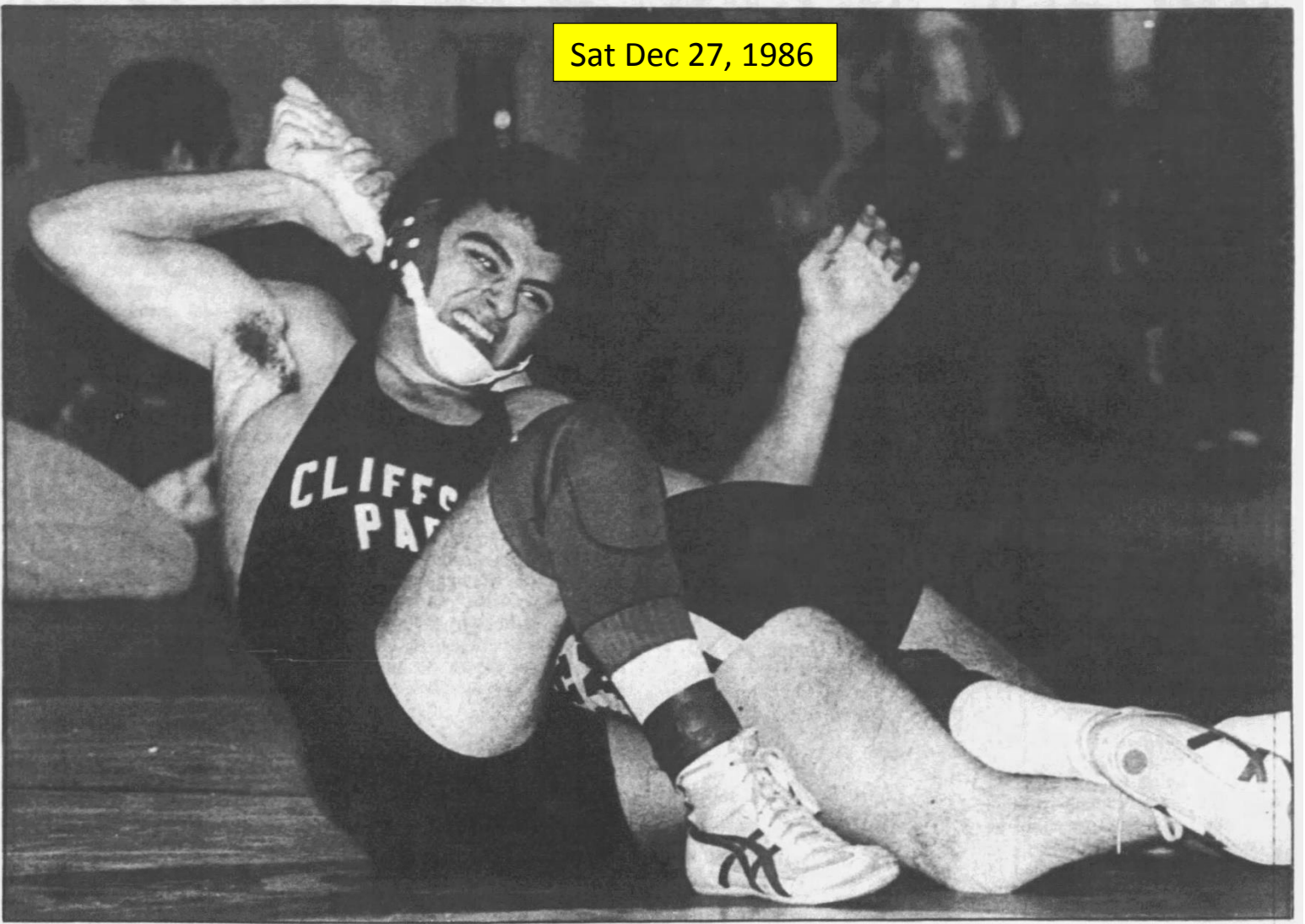

Top seeds Frank Manning of Bergenfield (134), Ken Carmichael of Paramus (128), and Drew Black of Mahwah (107) all have been impressive.

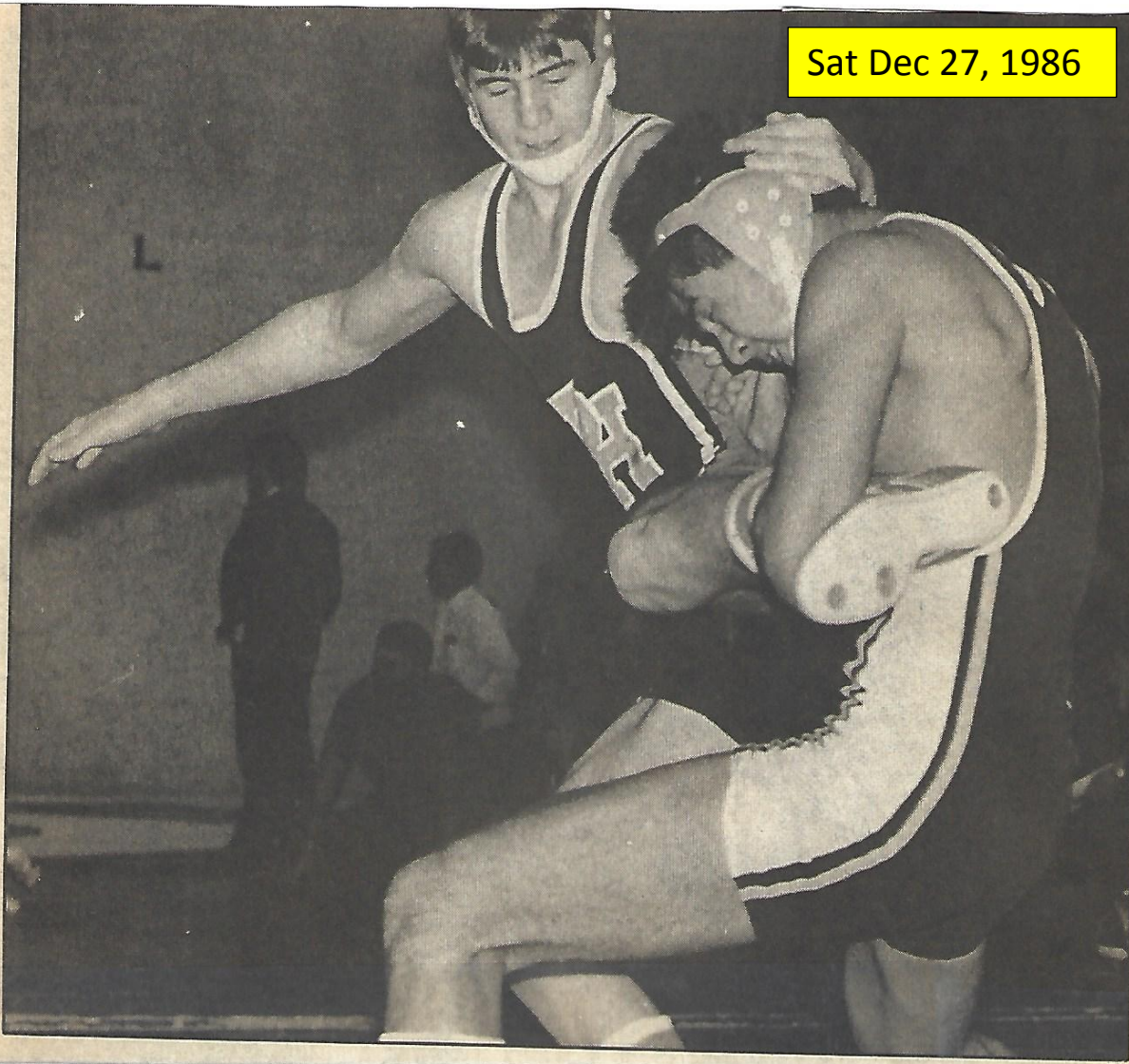

Pascack Hills fails to close in on Fair Lawn

HACKENSACK — It is a sport where winners are determined in six minutes or less. For Pascack Hills, the difference between first and second place in the Bergen County Coaches Association wrestling tournament may have come down to one second.

WRESTLING

Trailing by two points, 6-4, against Paramus 121-pound junior Mike Indorato, defending Region 1 champion Andy Van Horn of Pascack Hills successfully executed a

tilt to put Indorato on his back with six seconds left in their match.

"But he [Van Horn] didn't hold him for two seconds," Pascack Hills coach Bucky Rechain said. "Last year it was two points if you held a guy on his back for one second. They changed the rule this year."

So instead of Van Horn tying the match and sending it into overtime, Indorato registered the tournament's first major upset heading into today's semifinals and finals at Hackensack High School. It left Pascack Hills with 118 points, 14 behind mighty Fair Lawn in the team standings. Paramus is third with 111 points.

"Andy took it hard," Rechain said. "He's only a sophomore, but he wanted to be the first four-time county champion."

"I really think we could have given Fair Lawn a run, but 14 points could be too much to make up. Maybe with Andy, we could have done it."

So for the Cowboys, who at one point won this tournament 10 times in 11 years (1973-83), the realistic goal is a second-place finish to Fair Lawn for the second straight year.

There still are opportunities for bragging rights. In the semifinals, Pascack Hills and Fair Lawn go head-to-head in two weight classes. At 107 pounds, Rich

James of the Cowboys meets Fair Lawn's Steve Katz. At 140, Kevin Sheridan battles the Cutters' Joe Mocco. All four wrestlers have at least two pins through three rounds.

Another bone for the Cowboys is Brian Wells' bee-line for the Most Falls in Least Time award. Wells, the defending 148-pound state champion, began the tournament in an out-bracket and already has four falls.

Pascack Hills has seven wrestlers alive in the 1 p.m. semifinals, one fewer than Fair Lawn. Paramus sends six into the semis, Emerson four, and Westwood three.

The finals begin at 8 p.m., following the 6:30 consolations.

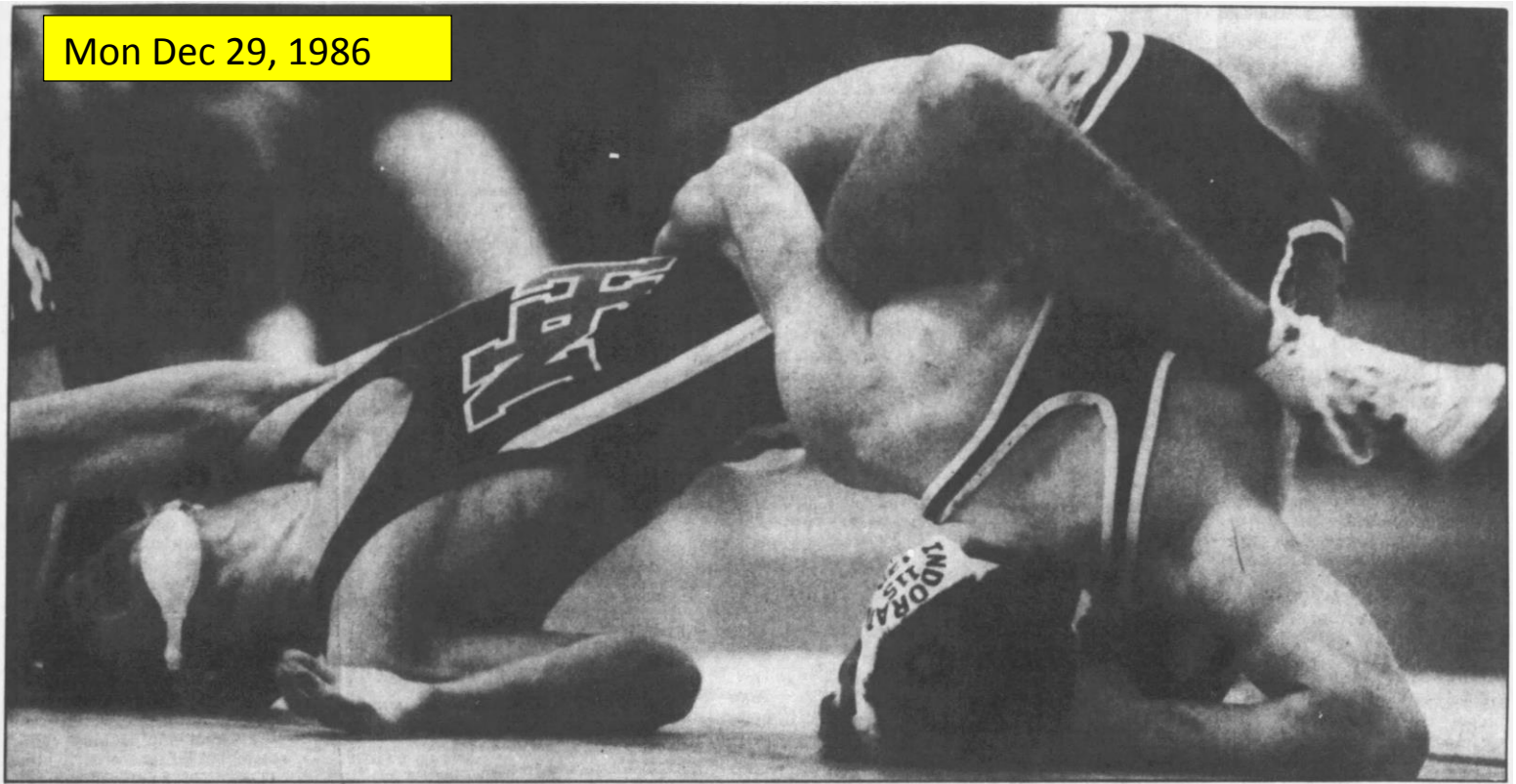

Fair Lawn fine on tournament mats

HACKENSACK — Fair Lawn coach Frank Guadagnino was elated but cautious as he hoisted the Bergen County Coaches Association's Holiday Wrestling Tournament team trophy into the air last night.

"Remember, we won this last year and then turned around and lost [a dual meet] to Elmwood Park," said Guadagnino.

There was no disputing Fair Lawn's superiority as a tournament team last night. The Cutters led Pascack Hills by 17 points following the afternoon's semifinals, and by 20 after the consolations. Joe Mocco, Neil Wright, and John Reese were champions as the Cutters romped with 220½ points to 192½ for Pascack Hills; Paramus was third with 185½.

Wright and Ken Carmichael of Paramus won for the third straight year. Fair Lawn (Group 4), Pascack Hills (3), Westwood (2), and Emerson (1) were team group champions. The title bouts follow:

101: Dumont senior Brian Sweeney, out most of last year with mononucleosis, posted an 8-2 victory over Matt Grossman of Pascack Hills. Grossman's consolation prize was the tournament pin trophy, won with four falls in only 4:07. Sweeney came off his back in the second period with a step-over reversal and two tilt points.

108: Mahwah's state bronze medalist Drew Black had four pins before handling Steve Katz of Paramus, 15-2. Black took Katz to his back with a headlock 33 seconds into the bout for a 5-0 lead.

115: The only takedown of the bout was decisive as North Bergen's Hector Moreno slipped out of a headlock with six seconds left and downed Fair Lawn's Mike Panico for a 3-1 win.

122: Mike Indorato, the meet's most outstanding wrestler, was countered by David Iacoponi of Northern Highlands until hitting

a takedown seven seconds into the second period. Five back points and an 11-5 victory followed. Indorato beat Region 1 champ Andy Van Horn in the quarters.

129: Carmichael romped, 6-1, over Shane Van Horn of Pascack Hills, starting with a full-lift takedown 18 seconds into the bout. He added two back points plus an arm-drag takedown.

135: Bergenfield's Frank Manning opened with a fireman's carry and added a single-leg takedown in the second period for a 4-0 win over Rob Meehan of Paramus.

141: Mocco edged Bergenfield's Brendan Ferriter, 5-2, with a second-period reversal and third-period switch escape.

148: State champion Brian Wells of Pascack Hills pinned four opponents and then built a 9-0 two-period lead over Emerson's Mike Mazzeo. Wells had five tilt points in the first period, while Mazzeo's points in the 9-2 bout were on late stall calls.

158: Wright led all the way in avenging a 5-2 Region 1 loss. He edged Emerson's Joe Mazzeo, 8-6, with a driving single-leg in the first period, a stepover reversal in the second, and a snap-down takedown with 1:19 left in the bout. Mazzeo's first-period rollout reversal and two excellent standup escapes made it close.

170: Reese scored a repeat championship, beating Cliff Chapman of Pascack Hills, 8-3, with four single-leg takedowns.

188: Westwood's Ben Salerno took a 3-0 lead on a second-period stand-up escape and takedown. He won, 4-1, over Fair Lawn's Steve Best, who weighed in at 169½.

Heavyweight: Elmwood Park's Tony Di-Pasquale used two takedowns, a reversal, and back points for a 9-2 win over Jim McGinty of Paramus, who scored a second-period takedown off a counter.
