HACKENSACK - The Bergen County Coaches Association Wrestling Tournament is a crowd pleaser because, for the first time in years, the team title is up for grabs going into the second and final day. But a master of ceremonies is needed to introduce the new faces who are dic-tating the action.

A case in point is 115-pounder Ron Holzberg, a late arrival to stardom




at Fair Lawn. "I wrestled part-var-sity last year, but I lost more than I won," said the tournament's biggest surprise. "I'm a senior now and a

Stoic sophomore clinches title for Pascack Hills

HACKENSACK - Chris LaRocca waited until his Pascack Hills coach, Bucky Rehain, had finished leaping in the air before applying a jubilant bear hug to the coach. Cowboy team-mates Paul Gravalis and Neil Car-fora rushed to join the celebration, while another teammate, the one re-sponsible for the merriment, showed no emotion as he bent to unfasten his ankle strap

That ritual taken care of, Tom Pepe stoically strode toward the

bedlam being created by his compatriots. Sophomores may be expected to lose their composure at times, but Pepe never did last night. His con-vincing 10-5 victory over Bergenfield senior John Hurley in the 148pound championship bout clinched the Bergen County Coaches Wres-tling Tournament team title for Hills

Hills. "He's paid his dues," said Rehain, whose team won for the eighth time in nine years. "He entered just about every summer tournament, he went out to Iowa for a month of wrestling, and he went to a couple of training camps. He earned it."

Pepe's win finally wrested the team title away from upstart Fair Lawn, which led through most of the two-day tournament. Gravalis's pin in the 188-pound semifinal bout ex-actly six hours earlier had given Hills a 2 ¹/₂-point lead over the Cut-ters, but Fair Lawn regained it with

consolation-round forfeit win by Rich Dougan.

The teams seemed to lack a killer instinct in the final round as Cutters Rich Holzberg, Joe Romano, Bill Juchnewich, and the Cowboys' Car-fora lost before Pepe took charge. Hills (144 ¹2 points) had two champi-ons. Pepe and Gravalis, while Fair Lawn (123) had none.

Summaries of title bouts follow 101 - Paramus Catholic's Tom Connor. Connor, after being taken down twice in the first period by BC's Jeff DiCocco, frustrated his opponent with a tight-waist ride, two back points, and a tying escape with 16 seconds remaining, finally winning, 6-5, on 1:45 of riding time

108 — Pete Gonzalez of Ridgefield Park swung fellow sophomore Tony Van Horn of Park Ridge down 12 seconds into the bout, added a sec-ond-period escape from his knees, and had 3:30 of riding time for a 4-0 win
