# Bergen tournament enticing

here will be numerous bouts to anticipate Tuesday and Wednesday when the Bergen County coaches holiday wrestling tournament is conducted at Paramus. One could be Morgan Horner of Hasbrouck Heights against Garfield's Ardian Ramadani, if they come in at the same weight.

Horner was named Most Outstanding Wrestler in the Garfield tournament Dec. 18 after fighting off Armadani, 9-7, in overtime of the 171pound final.

The report from Heights coach Mike Scuilla is that Horner opened a 7-2 lead on two outsidesingle takedowns,

one low double, and an escape. Ramadani came back spectacularly with a doubleunderhook hip toss, putting Horner to his back. Horner reversed, and Ramadani escaped at the final buzzer for a tie. Horner circled around for the winning move.

Dumont sophomore Anthony Dunkin had another big win, 9-7, in overtime over Garfield's Anthony Barber, who finished at the seventh-eighth level of the State tournament last season.

WRESTLING ON HIS MIND — While enjoying the football season, NJSIAA wrestling historian Bill Savage — the former Paramus and Elmwood Park coach was thinking about his favorite sport. He wants it told that two All-State players for Parochial 4 champion Bergen Catholic have fathers who wrestled. Tight endlinebacker Dominic Santoli's father, Gene, was a coaches tournament champion and also wrestled for Bucknell. Quarterback Matt LoVecchio's father, Larry, was a regional runner-up as a high school junior who broke an elbow his senior year and went on to play football at Franklin & Marshall. Tony Karcich, coach of Parochial Group 3 champion St. Joseph, was second in the state as a Hackensack senior.

APOLOGIES — We wrongly assumed in a recent season preview that Bergen County freshman tournament 145-pound champion Eric Mourkakos still was at Tenafly. He's not. He has transferred to

Bergen Catholic, we're informed.

CATCHING UP — Jason English of Hawthorne didn't do a lot of wrestling last season, but spent his time wisely. English's season got off to a late start because he had to sit out 30 days after transferring from Bergen Catholic. He took the mat for a while, but his season ended abruptly prior to the district tournament due to a separated shoulder. But in between delays, English won a Passaic County tour-

nament championship.

The 135-pound senior and his teammates opened the Mahwah tournament last weekend, and travel this week to the Hawk Classic at Manchester Township High School in Lakehurst, where the Toms River schools, Lacey Township, and Manchester will provide the competition. ... Ridgefield Park has a pair of transfers active: Rodney Bryson, who moved in from Atlanta; and Derek Picinich, whose family moved in from New Milford. The latter's family moved prior to last year's districts, so the wrestler lost out on an opportunity to compete in the postseason.

# Norgaard seeks share of history

Second in the State championships in March, St. Joseph middleweight Erik Norgaard is seeking to be second again this week, but with a major clarification. Norgaard is not hoping to be a runner-up.

The rugged senior's goal is to become only the second wrestler in the 40-year history of the Bergen County Coaches Association's Holiday Wrestling Tournament to be a four-time champion. Jason Hernandez of Bergen Catholic made the sweep from 1990 through '93 and went on to a State championship and a scholarship to Boston University.

Norgaard went unbeaten last year until the State title bout, when New Providence's Donnie DeFilippis battled off his back and pinned in the wildest bout of the finals in Atlantic City.

### WRESTLING

Paramus serves as the host school for the seventh year. The field of 48 teams and more than 450 wrestlers is so large that two gyms are used simultaneously for this morning's opening rounds. The quarterfinals are Tuesday night. George Jockish, director of one of the nation's largest tournaments since 1985, says 11 schools have served as host since the inception of the tournament, the brainchild of then-Tenafly coach Jack Armstrong. North Bergen is the only non-Bergen County school involved.

Returning champions and the weights at which they were victorious are Steven Hult of Pascack Valley (103), Mike Palo of St. Joseph (125), Chris Bitetto of Hackensack (135), Norgaard (140), and Austin Wall of Indian Hills (171).

Bitetto won a State championship in March, Norgaard took his silver medal, Hult was fifth, and Palo sixth. Bitetto is conducting his own crusade to sweep the counties. A junior, he is halfway there with consecutive Holiday titles.

Mike Massenzio, third in the State at 145 pounds last season with Indian Hills, has returned to his original school, St. Joseph, fortifying the Green Knights in their attempt to repeat as overall tournament champions.

Also back are three wrestlers who have much in common: Garfield's Anthony Barber (108 pounds last year), Bergen Catholic's Dominic Santoli (215), and Don Bosco Prep's Paul Siemon (145). All were second in the County and seventheighth in the State.

# Freshmen make their mark

# W-R's Marotta, BC's Kaiser off to a strong start

wo newcomers reached the Bergen County Coaches Holiday
Tournament finals at 103
pounds last week. However, veteran observers needed no introductions
when the two freshmen stepped forward.

Wood-Ridge's **Mike Marotta** was second in the State Federation tournament for middle-schoolers, and Bergen Catholic's **Rob Kaiser** was even better known. Kaiser was a three-time recreation All-American, an AAU national freestyle champion, and fifth in Greco-Roman style wrestling.



Marotta won, 7-6, on a takedown in the third period to become the first Bergen County champion from Wood-Ridge. He is coached by Evan Dolan, a three-time County champion while at Hasbrouck Heights who was a three-time NCAA qualifier at Rider

College, where he holds the records for takedowns in a season and in a career.

Dolan replaces his brother, **Sean**, who was offered a teaching position in Randolph. It was one of those offers a man cannot refuse. His wife, **Lisa**, recently gave birth to twins, giving them three toddlers to watch over.

The changing of the guard at Wood-Ridge was a natural. "Sean got the feeder program started and he handed it to me because he wanted it to fall into the right hands," he says. "Fortunately, a kid like Mike Marotta got interested in the program and when he wrestled in the County tournament people already knew about him. He's tough and he's been at or near the top every season [on the recreation level] and he's wrestled in a lot of states."

CORREGGIO IS DRIVEN: On an evening when former Bergen County champions Dan Weck and Gene Santoli handed out gold medals to their sons — new champions James Weck and Dominick Santoli, both of Bergen Catholic — Bergenfield's Bob Correggio stood tall. Correggio, the County 125-pound champion, is the first gold medalist from Bergenfield in 13 years. But he has battled longer odds. Correggio lost his mother to lung cancer when he was 12 and lost his father to brain stem cancer 25 months later.

JUST PLUGGING AWAY: Weck, voted the tournament's Most Outstanding Wrestler, proved to be solid in the hips during the entire tournament. He said he wasn't necessarily gunning for a second family title or intent on locking in the cradle that led him to a 9-6 win over

Lyndhurst's **Dennis McSweeney**. "I never compare myself to my father," he said. "I know he was good and I was just trying to do my best. I was happy I didn't gas early and I know you've always got a shot. I almost had the cradle earlier, but you just go with whatever is open."

THE CENTURY: Bob Whitaker, a 1965 State champion for Ridgewood, should have been included in the Honorable Mention list for The Record's Bergen County All-Century team instead of Bergen Catholic's Nick Fokas, who placed twice but did not win.

**HUSKY PERFORMANCE:** Behind the big three of Bergen Catholic, Indian Hills, and St. Joseph in the point standings were smaller schools Glen Rock and Dumont.

The fifth-place finish of Dumont is even more impressive, considering that two solid wrestlers who came up through the town program, freshman Matt McConville and sophomore Brian Lucas, compete for BC instead of the home school. Anthony Dunkin, one standout who stayed home, has been sensational for Frank Manning's Huskies and took second at 112 pounds to returning State medal winner Steve Hult. Dunkin, a sophomore, pinned all three of his other tournament opponents and had Hult down, 6-0, in the first period.

# Hackensack's Bitetto

# gains semis Tues Dec 28, 1999

PARAMUS — Hackensack junior Chris Bitetto stood next to his brother before squaring off against Saddle Brook's Bill Schneider on Tuesday, listening attentively to some final words of encouragement.

"Mentally, he helps me out a lot," Bitetto said of his brother, Rich, a 1996 State champion at 140 pounds. "I know that whatever he yells out, it's going to help me, so I listen to him. He told me to get my moves down, wrestle smart, and work for the pin."

### BERGEN WRESTLING

Chris Bitetto followed his brother's advice, scoring eight points before pinning Schneider in 1:16 to advance to the semifinals of the Bergen County Coaches Association Holiday Wrestling Tournament at Paramus High School. The two-day tournament concludes today, with semifinal action starting at 11 a.m. and the finals at 7 p.m.

Bitetto, the favorite in the 140-pound division after winning a State title at 135 pounds last season, is trying to earn his third County title in as many years, an accomplishment Hackensack coach John Stallone feels is well within his reach.

"People are expecting him to win this, but he still takes it one match at a time and takes everyone seriously," Stallone said. "He's a smart kid, and is always trying to get better. He never thinks it's OK to slow down, and never believes he's good enough."

Bitetto stormed through the first three rounds Tuesday, pinning Garfield's Antonio Chetta in 1:28 in the preliminary

round and felling Palisades Park's Alex Copp in 2:25 of the first round. His victory over Schneider improved his record to 6-0 for the season, with each win the result of a pin.

"I had good position and hand-fighting," Bitetto said of his quarterfinal win.
"This tournament helps me get some of the rust off from the off-season and get my technique and my moves down."

Another County title would give Bitetto a chance to make history in his senior year by winning four County titles. St.

Joseph's Erik Norgaard will try to become only the second wrestler to accomplish that feat today in the 145-pound division. Bergen Catholic's Jason Hernandez is the lone four-time winner, winning titles in 1990-93. But after tasting victory at the States last season, Bitetto has his sights set on loftier goals.

"I'm just getting set for States," Bitetto said. "That means everything. That's what I wanted my whole life, and there's nothing that can compare to that. Even if I never win four County titles, I've still had a good run."

Norgaard, a runner-up at last season's State tournament, faced little adversity during the first day of his quest for a fourth State title. He pinned Wood-Ridge's Nick Riccardella in 1:33 in the preliminary round and pinned Northern Highlands' Jesse Simons in 1:17 of the first round. In the quarterfinals, Norgaard faced Bitetto's teammate, Jason Chacon, and emerged with another first-period pin.

# Norgaard wins fourth

## Weck, Santoli lead BC to crown

PARAMUS — Despite becoming only the second wrestler in the 40-year history of the tournament to win four consecutive titles, St. Joseph's Erik Norgaard had a feeling he would not be named its Most Outstanding Wrestler of the Bergen County Coaches Holiday Tournament on Wednesday.

"It usually doesn't go to parochial schools," he said before picking up the Most Pins trophy — five in seven minutes, 38 seconds — the honor that precedes the biggest one, the Most Outstanding Wrestler. The 145-pound Norgaard was right and wrong. He did not earn the vote of the coaches, but a parochial-school wrestler did get it.

On what could have been labeled Family Night, the honor went to Bergen Catholic junior James Weck, the subject of the warmest story of the final round. The sixth-seeded 135-pounder became the first son of a former BCCA champion to win a title, and he did it with a flair, cradling top-seeded Dennis McSweeney of Lyndhurst from the top position with a minute left to tie, and then putting him to his back again for three points off a half-nelson for a 9-6 victory.

To make the scene even more heartwarming, Dan Weck, 130-pound champion in 1966 for Pascack Valley, presented the gold medal and ceremonial bout chart with father and son hug-

ging with great emotion.

"I figured it had been done before," the younger Weck said, explaining his surprise over the fuss made over him. The father-son combination was equaled later by Bergen Catholic's 215-pound champion Dominic Santoli, who followed in the footsteps of dad Gene Santoli, the heavyweight champion—also for Pascack Valley—in 1970. The Santolis also hugged on the mat as Gene made the award presentation.

It was the younger Santoli's convincing 16-5 win over Indian Hills' Bryan Diorio that clinched Bergen Catholic's team title. Heavyweight teammate Adam Ackermann capped it with a 2:08 pin of sixth-seeded Adam Buldo of Paramus as BC edged Indian Hills, 167-153½. Indian Hills finished second to St. Joseph last year. BC had not won since taking a fourth straight team title in 1996, and proved it is back under

coach Dave Bell after a rebuilding season last year.

There was big news all around as returning State champion Chris Bitetto of Hackensack, only a junior, won his third title, a 3:32 pin with a head-and-half on Northern Highlands' Matt Kenny at 140 pounds. Another junior, St. Joseph's Mike Palo, also took his third straight, with a tie-breaking single-leg takedown in the second period and an 8-5 win over Lodi's Rob DiDomenico at 130 pounds.

Mike Marotta of Wood-Ridge won a 7-6 battle with BC's Robert Kaiser at 103 pounds with a high double-leg takedown with 55 seconds left for a 7-5 lead to win his school's first Bergen County gold medal. Steve Hult of Pascack Valley repeated as a champion, downing Dumont's Anthony Dunkin, 13-6.

In a battle of former State medalists, Indian Hills' Ricky LaForge won at 119 pounds over Garfield's Jeff Alfonso, 6-3, as he stacked out of Alfonso's duck-under and got the takedown with 10 seconds remaining. It was a major step forward

"The last time we met, it wasn't a very good experience," he said. "He beat me in the region last year and I think I made up for it tonight."

Austin Wall of Indian Hills repeated at 189 pounds, 9-4, over St. Joseph's Matt Romeo with double-leg, spin, and driving takedowns.

Bergenfield 125-pounder Bob Correggio prevented Dave Ferrell from winning Bergen Tech's first title with a workaround takedown with 42 seconds left for a 4-2 win. Don Bosco Prep's Paul Siemon won at 152 pounds, 15-5, over Indian Hills' seventh-seeded Dave Amerman, who wrestled last year for Ramapo. State bronze medalist Mike Massenzio of St. Joseph won at 160 pounds, 9-1 over Fort Lee's Mike Radoian. Massenzio was a transfer from Indian Hills, which could have used his points. Two titanic bursts for reversals in the second period lifted Hasbrouck Heights' Morgan Horner past Glen Rock's Evan Tryforos, 9-1, at 171.

Norgaard, who moves with a most confident walk, said he's always as calm



as he looks. "Just another day at the office," he said after a 1:50 pin of Don Bosco's Frank Petrucci with an armbar and half. "The pressure match, that's

the ideal. That's what you're looking for, and I've been in that situation a million times. [I've been wrestling] since I was born."

He and BC's Jason Hernandez are the lone four-time winners.















# A passion for winning

restling has been a way of life for Erik
Norgaard for so long that he hardly remembers when he started in the sport.
It was almost preordained that he would wrestle because his father Gary wrestled for Leonia and older brother Karl was All-County at St. Joseph.

"I really can't remember when wrestling wasn't part of my life," says Norgaard, who is The Record's Athlete of the Week. He also could add that winning is a way of life as he's captured 107 bouts, with 10 coming this season. That includes five pins in seven minutes 38 seconds while capturing his fourth consecutive Bergen County Coaches Holiday Wrestling Tournament championship.

Wrestling takes up so much of his time, especially in the summer, that "The high school season is sort

of my off-season."

This is not to say the sport is everything, because he's never neglected his studies at St. Joseph and currently stands sixth in his class. Pointing up his excellent academics is that he's almost a straight-A student who slipped below that only twice (a B in precalculus and a B-plus in biology). In September he'll be tested in the classroom and on the mat when he enrolls at Columbia.

"I also looked at Brown, Rutgers, Lehigh, and Virginia," he says. "But I liked the fact that Columbia

was near home and I really will enjoy living in the city." He'll probably study pre-law, and at least for now is thinking of eventually getting into investment banking. "That's where the money is."

Meanwhile, he has a big senior year in front of him, with a State title high on the list. He's still upset over losing in the championship last year to New

Providence's Dennis DeFilippis.

"I can still see it in my mind and I'm not sure what happened," says Norgaard. "It was 0-0, I had him on his back, and suddenly I made a mistake and he pinned me. I'm looking to catch up to him in college."

During his early years, he also played baseball, football, and soccer. "I really thought of playing football in high school," he says, "because I love to hit people on the field. But as a freshman I gave it up to concentrate on wrestling."

The transition to high school wrestling was easy because his coach, Kerry "Hef" Kohlheffer, coached

him in a Garfield recreation program.

"I knew he'd be special," says Kohlheffer, "because he worked his way to the finals in every tourney he entered, and as a sixth-grader entered the National Junior event and placed third. He has always been a natural and is even better this year because he's a little stronger and smarter."

He's also the school's vice president and is a member of the Spanish Society and Cooking Club. "I love to cook," he says, "pasta is my specialty. And probably my best dish is chicken Marsala."

When school is over he'll be hitting the road to participate in major freestyle and Greco-Roman tournaments. Last summer he went to Oklahoma for the National Duals championships and posted a 7-2 record that included a loss to the No. 5 wrestler in the world. This year he hopes to improve on that record.

But winning a State championship is the goal!





### **DAMION LOGAN, St. Joseph, 1996**

Only the seventh wrestler in 63 years to reach the State finals all four years, Logan won as a freshman (103 pounds in 1993), junior (126 in '95), and senior (135 in '96). Among his then-County record 122 wins were two decisions over another eventual three-time champion, Lyndhurst's Don Pritzlaff. However, Logan suffered a concussion during their 1994 State-semis brawl and his only State-finals loss followed. Aggressive with great escapability, Logan is wrestling at the University of Michigan.

### PETE GONZALEZ, Ridgefield Park, 1983

Gonzalez (109-6-1) was fifth as a sophomore, took the State 115-pound title as a junior in 1983, but was third as a senior despite 30 wins and 25 pins. One of the sad scenes of high school wrestling was that of Gonzalez and his brother/coach Tony on their knees crying after his loss in the semis. Pete was an All-American at Montclair State and is a private wrestling instructor.

# WRESTLERS

### LIGHTWEIGHTS

### **LELAND STRECKER, Teaneck, 1939**

Teaneck's power began with its leadoff man, surprisingly strong for his size. Strecker won the championship at 95 pounds in 1938 at the fifth annual State championship tournament (held at Elizabeth's Grover Cleveland Junior High) and the 105-pound title in 1939, when Teaneck was the host school.

### **DENNIS SULLIVAN, Leonia, 1951**

Sullivan was voted the Most Outstanding Wrestler of the 1951 tournament after pinning Roselle Park's talented Bob Hahn in 4:03 for the 120-pound title. A year earlier, he was fourth. He went on to compete at Lehigh and eventually became one of New Jersey's finest officials.

### KERIN RAFTERY, Fair Lawn, 1963

The 1963 Most Outstanding Wrestler stopped two aces at 123 pounds: Phillipsburg's Carl Bateman and top-seeded Dave Gleitzman of Union. Raftery wrestled at Syracuse and is the last high school wrestler from the state to place in the Senior Freestyle Nationals. His offseason workouts with Passaic's All-Century choice Dave Pruzanksy (Temple) are legendary.

### ED KOCHAKJI, Bergenfield, 1968

No high school wrestler yet has been credited with having better balance than Kochakji, who won three titles, from 1966 through 1968 (freshmen could not wrestle varsity), once at 115 and twice at 123 pounds. He was voted the State's MOW twice and was a career 80-2 with 70 pins. At C.W. Post, he never lost a dualmeet match and was fourth in the NCAA championships. Kochakji is head coach at Bergen Community College.

### TOM HUSTED, Pascack Hills, 1977

As a freshman, Husted made an immediate impact and put Pascack Hills on the map by reaching the State quarterfinals. He qualified all four years, was fourth once, and won in 1976 (as MOW) and '77. Some say Husted's 6-5 overtime win over Darryl Burley in the 1977 semifinals was the state's greatest bout ever. Burley, an eventual NCAA champion, was Husted's teammate at Lehigh.

### JASON HERNANDEZ, Bergen Catholic, 1994

Fourth twice in the tournament after reaching the semis both times, Hernandez won in grand style as a senior, building a 10-3 lead and pinning returning champion Mike Sandelier of Washington Township (Gloucester County) with a cradle in 3:20. The four-time Bergen County champion set a County record for wins at the time with a 121-8 record and is wrestling at Boston University.

### **MIDDLEWEIGHTS**

### ROBERT MOONE, Teaneck, 1941

Each year, Moone added 10 pounds and continued winning. He opened with the 125-pound title as a sophomore in 1939 and succeeded the next two years as the winner at 135 and 145 pounds. Team point totals were kept in the tournament those days, and Teaneck had the top score all three years Moone won.

### TOM BOCCHINO, Fair Lawn, 1961

Looking back, fans consider Bocchino the Muhammad Ali of wrestling. He was outspoken, but backed up what he predicted. A great competitor, he won at 136 pounds in 1961 and went on to star at NYU and place in the National AAU championships.

### JOEL RAUCCI, Leonia, 1972

Raucci won so handily in the 1972 semifinals over Garry Osborne of Phillipsburg that the hard-to-impress P'burg fans showed their respect by giving him a standing ovation. Raucci won in 1971 and '72. Sadly, he died at a young age.

### **BRIAN WELLS, Pascack Hills, 1987**

Only once has the Most Outstandig Wrestler prize been shared. That's when Wells shared it in 1987 with Steve Rivera of Manalapan. Wells was a two-time champion (141 pounds and 148) with a State record of 83 career pins. He was one of the first local wrestlers to stress takedowns in practice and took his expertise to Maryland.

### CHRIS CATALFO, Pascack Hills, 1978

Catalfo soared beyond his 1977 win and '78 second-place finish to Passaic County All-Decade pick Tony Surage of Passaic Valley. He went on to Syracuse, became a member of the 1984 Olympic Greco-Roman team, was a National Greco-Roman champion in 1985, a PanAm Games champion in 1987, and twice a World Cup runner-up.

### SAL MESSINA, Teaneck, 1961

In his championship season of '61, Messina came back from a broken arm suffered in football and beat another championship-bound matman, Bocchino, in a dual meet. The captain of the Teaneck powerhouse, Messina also wrestled at Maryland.

### DON PRITZLAFF, Lyndhurst, 1997

Aggressive but extremely smooth shifting from move to move, the three-time high school champion is destined to be an NCAA champion soon, the experts say. Pritzlaff's a standout at Wisconsin, where he has won Junior Freestyle and Junior Nationals titles and is twice an All-American. In high school, he won three county, four district, and four regional titles as well and topped Logan's County win mark with a 127-4 career record

# WRESTLERS

### **UPPERWEIGHTS**

### **CHARLIE GUNNER, Teaneck, 1944**

One of the toughest of the early wrestlers, Gunner won in 1944 at 165 pounds and also proved to be outstanding in another aggressive sport as a Golden Gloves boxing champion. He later coached three Teaneck wrestlers to gold medals: James Balquist (1958), Robert Jalil (1959), and Messina (1961). At the 1967 State championships, Gunner received the Harry E. Lake Award for contributions to wrestling.

### RAY REICHERT, Fair Lawn, 1957

The 1957 Most Outstanding Wrestler was a great physical specimen who intimidated opponents merely by stepping onto the mat. Longtime Hunterdon Central coach Russ Riegel referred to Reichert as one of the best wrestlers he has seen. He proved to be as strong as he looked by handling Rahway's powerful Carlos Garay, 7-2, for the 157-pound title.

### JON BOGERT, Leonia, 1959

Technically sound, extremely strong, and highly skilled is the way Bogert is described. He won the 169-

pound title in 1959, a great switch being his most deadly weapon. Bogert went on to star in the classroom and on the mat at Yale.

### **GEORGE GALLER, East Paterson, 1964**

The powerful Galler is the only Bergen County wrestler to defeat Hackensack's Reggie Williams, who was a state second- and fourth-place finisher. Galler was third in 1963 and won in 1964, at 168 pounds. He is the only two-time Bergen County scoring champion in football and outgained his backfield mate at Wyoming, eventual Miami Dolphins star Jim Klick.

### **JACK INSERRA, Pascack Hills, 1981**

The prototype of a 188-pound wrestler, Inserra was a prequarterfinalist with Paramus Catholic before shifting to Hills. He lost to All-Century teammate and close friend Bill Hyman in a summer tournament, but avenged the loss in the Bergen County Holiday tournament before Hyman moved to heavyweight. Inserra learned from brother Frank and won with balance and strength. He wrestled and played football at Penn State.


### **BILL HYMAN, Saddle Brook, 1981**

Hyman immediately followed Inserra to the gold medal stand that year, which was only right. It seemed he and Inserra drove each other to greatness. Hyman was one of the great big men, trimmer than most heavyweights and more mobile. A student of the game and pushed by his brother, Mark. Hyman was an NCAA champion at Temple.


